Agenda item 12 Social Housing

Excerpt from email regarding Social Housing sought advice from a colleague in planning to quickly and informally review the potential for the site you sent me (thank you). Unfortunately they aren't keen. The site doesn't appear deliverable as a Rural Exception Site (RES) because:

- Whilst close to a settlement boundary it is still relatively remote from key services. Only a bus stop within close walking distance and even then reliant on an unsurfaced verge. Creating a pavement would add cost to the scheme.
- I agree that it is borderline in terms of size, and runs a risk that it wouldn't be big enough for an RP to achieve sufficient economies of scale to develop as a standalone site.
- The scrub / immature woodland may present challenges in respect of biodiversity net gain.

I realise that Polstead is a dispersed settlement so the perfect option may not exist. The bullets above are an informal view without prejudice, but I do not recommend running with this option at this time. Put it on your list but fingers crossed you can find a better one. I am happy to ask Planning colleagues for informal views once you have a shortlist.

Agenda item 19 Post and rails around the village pond

On 2023-08-29 15:33, Georgia Hall (SCC Councillor) wrote: Hi All.

I have received the following update from my highways officer.

"I am writing to update you that based on the survey measurements from the existing boundary features we have now accepted and recorded the railings at Polstead Pond with our Highways Records Team as under Suffolk Highways ownership. I have inspected the rails and discussed the requested maintenance with the Asset Team. Although maintenance here is a priority for the Parish it unfortunately does not score highly when assessed and ranked against all other required street furniture works in Suffolk. I can log the request for works but I am not hopeful that we will get any highways funding to be able to improve the condition anytime soon as the highway budgets are fully committed for the coming year.

My observation is that the rails and posts are quite old and whilst it is hoped that the existing can be maintained, reset and poles replaced, my concern is that the concrete is not as strong as it once was and the posts and rails may be fragile due to age, crumble and break and may need completely replacing, but it's hard to know before works are underway. Also, if some rails and posts are replaced the mix of old and new may not have the desired kerb appeal and not look great visually at this very picturesque spot. The Parish may wish to consider the merit in complete replacement; however, I understand that there may not be funds available to do this. I am aware that the parish has already received a quote from a contractor and if external funds can be found to engage the contractor independently my suggestion would be that the Parish and Contractor progresses the project via the community self-help scheme. They will need to ensure that the contractor is accredited to work on the highway and holds the necessary liability insurance, the Contractor would be responsible for gaining the necessary road space booking through Network Assurance. Here is a link to the relevant SCC website page: Road Space Booking - Suffolk County Council [1]. This would probably be the easiest and quickest way to get works underway.

Alternatively, if the PC or you would like to fund completely, or share / part fund the works through Suffolk Highways this is possible.

I have spoken with our operations team and we are approaching time when we need to prioritise works that will be delivered in this contract and those that will be delivered by our new service provider so if you would like to go with this option I must be upfront and say that the earliest estimated delivery would be end of this year / early 2024 - but this would need to be confirmed depending on when the order was placed and the scope of the works package decided on."

I am currently awaiting a quote from Suffolk highways which should be with me by Sept/October.
